WELCOMES YOU ABOARD !!

For the maximum enjoyment of your vacation and the safety of your crew, please read the confirmation and all enclosures carefully, and advise all members of your party of the policies and safety procedures.

Since you will be the "Captain" on this trip, it is our hope that the orientation cruise and the following information will aid us in giving you the tools necessary to help make your voyage more enjoyable.

Please Note:

NO PETS ALLOWED

We will refuse boarding to anyone arriving with a pet and your deposit will be forfeited.

HOW TO GET THERE:

HEADING NORTH- Take I-5 15 miles north of Redding to Lake Shasta Caverns/O'Brien off ramp, exit #695, turn left and go under the freeway, take southbound I-5 one mile to Packers Bay Road off-ramp, exit #693. Turn right on Packers Bay Road, and go 2 miles to the marina which is adjacent to the public facility.

HEADING SOUTH- Take southbound I-5 to Packers Bay Road off-ramp, exit #693. Turn right on Packers Bay Road, and go 2 miles to the marina which is adjacent to the public facility.

DOCK HOURS: 7 DAYS A WEEK 8 A.M. TO 5 P.M.

The support team will be available for service during the above hours daily. Should you require service due to a breakdown, call the dock number above. If you do not receive an answer, call the reservation number. From 5 P.M. to 8 A.M. there will be a caretaker on the premises.

NO SERVICES WILL BE AVAILABLE DURING THIS TIME (5 P.M. to 8 A.M.)

GATE HOURS: 8A.M to 5 P.M.

The entrance gate to the marina parking lot will be opened daily at 8 A.M. and will be closed each evening at 5 P.M. In case of **EMERGENCY or if prior arrangements have been made** the caretaker will open the gate after hours.

PARKING & LAUNCHING:

We provide parking and have a launch ramp for our customers' use. To assure adequate parking for our customers, we have a parking lot attendant. Please notify all members in your party of the name under which your reservation is booked. No one will be admitted to the marina parking lot unless they know the reservation name.

The gate to the marina lot will be locked from 5 P.M. to 8 A.M. If anyone anticipates leaving during the evening or early morning hours, they must notify the parking lot attendant prior to arrival and make arrangements to have the gate opened or park in the public lot, which is adjacent to our marina.

There will be a charge to park or launch in the public facility.

CHECK IN PROCEDURE:

1. To avoid a long wait, please arrive no more than one hour prior to your scheduled check-in time. Check in with the parking attendant. We do not have a restaurant or comfortable waiting area, so arriving early can be uncomfortable on a hot day.
2. To facilitate loading your supplies on the houseboat, carts are available. If supplies are loaded in your small boat, you may choose to launch first and load directly to the houseboat.
3. Please park your car in our private parking area and launch your boat at our boat ramp. The parking lot attendant will advise you. **There is a charge to park in the public parking area and to launch your boat at the public ramp. YOUR CAR WILL BE TICKETED IF THE FEES ARE NOT PAID. Packers Bay Marina has no control over this, so please park in our private parking lot and use our boat ramp to avoid these extra charges.**
4. DUE TO INSURANCE AND LIABILITY CONCERNS, WE MUST INSIST THAT ALL PERSONS WHO WILL BE OPERATING THE HOUSEBOAT RECEIVE OPERATION AND SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS AND SIGN THE RENTAL AGREEMENT THAT THEY HAVE RECEIVED INSTRUCTION.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURE:

Make a note of the return time on your confirmation. We will expect you at or before that time. Keep in mind the hours the dock and gate will be open.

CLEANING PROCEDURE:

In order for your full deposit to be returned, the houseboat must be clean, and undamaged, with the inventory intact.

We expect surface cleanliness: all kitchen and wetbar appliances, sinks and countertops wiped down. Dishes, utensils, pots and pans clean. Toilets, sinks and shower wiped down. Floors swept and mopped. Daily general housekeeping will help avoid a big clean up job on the last day.

Please check through all closets, cupboards and drawers for any of your items that may have been missed when packing.

SERVICE DURING THE WEEK:

The support team is available from 8 A.M. daily for service. We anticipate that a weekly rental will need service at least twice during the week. If service is necessary, pull up to the gas dock and your holding tank will be pumped, your garbage removed and any other services you may require will be handled. In order to avoid a delay call ahead to notify the dock that you are coming in for a service. This will allow the crew preparation time. Due to the new grey water regulations the septic barge must be emptied several times a day. A call ahead, though not necessary will assure that the crew will have the barge empty or they will be able to tell you when it will be. Check your dish soap, toilet tissue and garbage bags. Your supply will be replenished if needed. There is no charge or limited number of services, as long as you return to Packers Bay Marina. If you choose to go elsewhere for service, you will not be reimbursed for any charges.

BOAT OPERATION:

The Holiday Flotels houseboat has been designed and built specifically for rental operation. Incorporated in it are many features for your comfort and safety. Like any piece of equipment, there is a right way and a wrong way to use it. The following information will aid in making your vacation on Shasta Lake one “worth writing home about.”

The most important part of your “orientation cruise” will be the handling of your houseboat! We will spend whatever time necessary to make you feel comfortable at the helm. (No one has flunked yet, and often those who have never handled a boat before do the best.) The four rules for safe operation are:

1. Set the wheel for desired direction before applying power.
2. Allow ample clearance when making turns. These boats do not turn sharply.
3. When operating in reverse, have an observer posted at the rear of the boat to help guide you
4. Come into a dock or shore at trolling speed and apply reverse three (3) boat lengths away.

Make sure the above information is covered during your orientation and that you understand all four rules. Remember, your houseboat has a lot of weight behind it and can cause damage to the dock if you aren't slowed down. Your craft is large and stable, and speeds can easily be deceptive. You are trying to stop 28,000 pounds of boat, and frankly, it's like slowing down a freight train-it takes some doing. Cut your speed twice

as far out as you think you should, and you'll probably be just right. In fact, "it's better to stop short than long, and then just ease her in." We are proud of our fleet and want people to know we did more than show you where the key was. When cruising, keep a sharp lookout for shallow areas, logs, swimmers, and other boats. Underwater obstacles may not be marked. **ALSO, WHEN CRUISING ALL GATES MUST BE CLOSED AT ALL TIMES, AND NO RUNNING ON THE UPPER DECK!**

One of the many things that make Shasta Lake so ideal for houseboating is its shelter from high winds. However, if winds should come up while you are cruising, reduce power to prevent prop cavitation and proceed at low speed to one of Shasta's multitude of beautiful inlets. Make sure you are well protected from wind by hills. If a breeze is blowing in the cove you select, find one that is more sheltered. You'll sleep better and so will we! In windy weather we suggest you relax and remain tied up in a cove. If you must venture out, avoid cruising across large sections of "open water." We advise you to avoid visiting marinas for fuel or supplies unless it's a real emergency because boat control is difficult and serious collision damages can result. In the case of the Bimini, Horizon and especially the Constellation, the potential for collision is much greater due to the reduced steering capabilities and larger surface areas. Most boat docks are secured with overhead or submerged cable and during windy periods these cables tend to raise and lower considerable distances and may produce some real navigational hazards. Houseboats, due to the added height of the upper bunk house and the radar bridge, may not pass under the overhead cables used at some marinas. Post a crew member on the front, back and upper deck to make certain your boat will clear all obstacles, when backing the boat away from shore with a strong wind blowing against the stern, continue reverse, a substantial distance before attempting a turn. If you don't you will probably blow sideways to shore and suffer all the accompanying problems. Reverse response is limited with a boat as heavy as a houseboat, but if proper forethought is given to handling in windy weather, many problems can be avoided.

If your pontoons have touched shore and you are in the process of making a tie-up but wind conditions blow the boat around, leave engine running and in forward gear apply enough power to pivot the stern away from shore. Your crew can then drive the tie-stakes and complete tie-up. When tied up and strong winds threaten to pull the stakes loose, use the engine in forward gear to maintain a perpendicular position against the beach until the wind subsides. The Bimini, Horizon and Constellation require the operator to be at the lower helm when mooring or docking the boat. We also suggest using all four stakes and ropes supplied with the Bimini, Horizon and Constellation.

**Always tie up in a cove at night using all lines on board.
No cruising is allowed after dark!**

Two to three hours of cruising or running the generator should be done each day to keep the batteries charged, as there are many items on board which they must power. Turn off electric lights when they are not needed to save your battery. No running lights are required when tied up at night. Be sure to have the Electric Water pump switch off when the water system is not in use and while you are cruising !!!

Fuel and oil requirements will be covered during your orientation cruise. In the event your engine does not start after one minute, allow the starter to cool for five minutes prior to a second attempt. An overheated starter can be burned out. Often, an engine that will not start readily has been flooded, so letting it sit a few minutes should correct this condition. If the engine will not start after several attempts, contact us for help and save your batteries, as there could be an engine problem which we should check out.

Please do not permit your children to play with the engine controls. Engaging the throttle shift-lever when the engine is not running may result in damage to the shifting fork, which in turn can result in repairs and lost cruising time.

During engine operation, please allow the engine to “Idle down” in the neutral position before shifting from one gear to another. It is also helpful to use a “Positive” shifting action when you move the throttle shift-lever from the neutral position to either forward or reverse. The tendency to shift to slowly grinds the gears and causes excessive wear to the lower drive unit. The “grinding” sound is apparent if you listen for it. Please do not use “full reverse” throttle when backing up. Normally about ½ or ⅔ throttle is sufficient for proper reverse control. The Bimini, Horizon and Constellation controls, being much more sensitive, require a soft touch when shifting into gear. You must **FEEL** the shift into gear before applying throttle.

The refrigerators, oven, range, BBQ, wall heater, and hot water heater are all operated with propane. There is plenty on board so don't worry about running out. The re-lighting of these appliances will be covered during your orientation cruise. For your safety-if you smell gas and are unable to determine the source, we advise that you shut off the propane tanks located in the two boxes on the forward deck. This action will turn off related appliances including refrigerators. Contact the marina as soon as possible for assistance.

There are approximately 40 gallons of cooking and drinking water on board.

The pressure water system uses the lake water for dishes and showers. This water is heated by your propane water heater and the system is put into operation by turning on your water pump switch at the Captain's wheel. The pressure water system can only be used when the boat is stopped or at very low speed, and the pump switch should be off when the boat is underway.

SAFETY:

Water oriented activities can, by their very nature, be dangerous. It is your responsibility to abide by the established rules of this facility, laws of Boat regulations of the State of California and County of Shasta, and by the use of common sense and respect for others, and to see that the members of your party do likewise.

For your safety please read the Houseboating safety Rules below:

1. It is unlawful to operate vessels while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
2. The use of fireworks or the launching of water balloons, golf balls, or any other projectiles is against the law and may result in a fine imposed by the Sheriff as well as deposit and boat forfeiture.

3. Do not store gas cans on board houseboat.
4. Children and non-swimming adults should wear life jackets on outside deck areas. No unsupervised children on top deck.
5. No jumping or diving from top deck or railings.
6. No swimming around boat while engine is running or boat is in motion.
7. No swimming within 200 feet of docks or launch ramps.
8. No cruising after dark.
9. Quartz flood lights should not be moved from their position. Damage to internal wiring could cause electrical shock or fire.
10. Persons aboard not to exceed listed sleeping capacity.
11. When towing other boats, tie ropes to cleats and not to railings or gates.
12. Do not tie two or more houseboats together. Do not jump from roof to roof.

TOILET SYSTEM:

Mansfield Head: The Mansfield head empties into a holding tank. If additional water is needed in the bowl before flushing, lift the pedal. In the Mansfield system, the control chemical has been added directly into the holding tank before you board the boat. If needed you will find extra chemical in the cabinet under the bathroom sink.

DO NOT FLUSH SANITARY NAPKINS, TAMPONS, KLEENEX-TYPE, WET STRENGTH TISSUE, OR ANY OTHER ITEMS NOT NORMALLY DEPOSITED IN A HOUSEHOLD TOILET AS THEY WILL PLUG THE SYSTEM.

GREY WATER:

As of September 2006 we are required to contain all grey water (Shower and sink) which is stored in a holding tank and must be emptied when full, approximately every 3 days. Try to limit your water usage.

With larger groups, the tank may need emptying every 3-4 days. You may return to our marina and the necessary pumping will be done at "no charge." If you have the holding tank pumped at another resort, there is a fee which you will be required to pay.

BBQ:

With gas valve OFF, raise the lid, light match and put into small hole at lower right hand corner of BBQ. Then turn on gas valve. After lighting, look in same hole to make sure it stays lit. If not lit, turn gas valve off and wait five minutes with lid up before repeating.

REFRIGERATORS:

You should use your refrigerator for food only and not beverages (use ice chest for warm beer and soft drinks to be cooled). The refrigerator should be cold for you when you arrive. Placing warm drinks or food into the refrigerator or holding the door open for long periods causes the refrigerator to warm up and it will not cool down again for 8-12 hours, depending upon the heat of the day. Opening the refrigerator door sparingly will help keep your food cold during your vacation. The refrigerator will operate properly only if

the boat sits level in the water. If the bow of the boat is beached too high, the refrigerator cooling unit will be damaged.

The following tips are intended to help you understand how the propane refrigerators do and don't work. Results will vary according to the amount for food placed in the refrigerator, the temperature of the food when placed in the refrigerator, the outside air temperature, the number of times the door is opened and how long the door is left open. Propane refrigerators will be approximately 50 degrees during the daytime. We suggest you use the freezers or ice chests for highly perishable foods. The refrigerators will be pre-set by our crew according to the outside air temperature. During the summer, they will be set on **Gas** and **Max**. In the spring and fall when the outside air temperatures are cool, it may be necessary to turn them down. We suggest **Gas** and **5**, then adjust the temperature dial as necessary. **DO NOT TURN THE DIALS TO ELECTRIC**, as this will turn the refrigerator off. If there is ice in the freezers, the refrigerators are working to the best of their ability. If the ice begins to thaw and the door is not ajar, put your perishables on ice and call us, or return to the marina.

1. Keep the boat level
 - a. It is very important for the boat to be kept level when you are tied up. **DO NOT RUN UP ON THE BEACH**. Just touch the front of the pontoons to the shore. If parked in one place for several days, remember that the lake level changes and it will be necessary to adjust the position of the boat daily.
2. Tips for warm weather operation of refrigerators:
 - a. Plan how to load beforehand. Make notes and keep them handy as to what is in each refrigerator. Load the refrigerators as quickly as possible as the refrigerator will warm to room temperature if the doors are left open for very long. It can take 8 to 12 hours for the refrigerators to recover on a hot day.
 - b. Do not pack the refrigerator completely full. Some **air circulation** is needed for them to work most efficiently.
 - c. Freeze as much meat as possible. If all meat cannot be frozen, cook as much as possible. Hamburger to be used for spaghetti, tacos, Etc. will keep longer cooked than raw and unfrozen.
 - d. Place the food you expect to use over the first few days in the front refrigerator as it seems to get opened more often.
 - e. Keep milk, soft drinks and beer in the ice chests rather than in the refrigerator. The few extra dollars spent on ice will pay off if you can keep your refrigerator cooler.
 - f. Keep snack foods in the ice chest and make the refrigerators off limits to children.
 - g. Know what you want to get out of the refrigerator before opening the door and don't hold the door open any longer than necessary. The temperature will rise each time the door is opened.

3. WHEN UNLOADING THE REFRIGERATORS ON THE DAY YOU TURN THE HOUSEBOAT IN, PLEASE DO NOT TURN THE REFRIGERATORS OFF.

You may leave any unused food in the refrigerator....our crew loves leftovers.

Holiday Flotels' boats are among the cleanest, best equipped and maintained in California. We do our utmost to keep everything in good repair, but cannot foresee breakdowns due to mishandling or mechanical defects. We are not responsible for any loss of time due to mechanical failure of any kind. If you should have a problem, please contact us for service. If we get your message of trouble in the evening, we won't be out until the next morning. It is too dangerous to be cruising after dark. **No refunds will be made for loss of time due to repairs.** Careless handling of craft results in added cost to you and possible loss of time. There will be charges on a cost basis for any items lost or broken. Personal injury and damage to the boats can result by tying boats together, throwing or projecting water balloons, eggs, and other objects. Injuries can be quite serious and damages can be costly. Fireworks are illegal on Shasta Lake, so please leave them home. We expect the boat to be returned clean. If it is not, there will be a minimum fee of \$50.00.

Thank you for reserving your houseboat through Packers Bay Marina. We hope your trip is a pleasant one. We look forward to serving you, and hope that you have a relaxing, carefree, and safe vacation.
